All the members of the Maribyrnong Orchid Society would like to wish a very Happy Birthday to Gerald McCraith AM.

Our highly esteemed Patron Gerald celebrated his 99th Birthday on Sunday 24th February. To celebrate this happy event, Gerald, his sister May, his daughters June and Lois, his grandchildren and his 2 great-great grandchildren all enjoyed a party gathering at a Chinese Restaurant. Our Gerald loves Chinese food.

For those who do not know, Gerald McCraith is the Patron of our Orchid Society. Gerald was one of the founding members of the Australian Orchid

Foundation and was also once President of the Victorian Orchid Club.

Gerald's interest in orchids started before marrying his lovely late wife Nell. In the late 1920's Gerald would visit the Victoria Market to do shopping. There he would see a fellow selling Stag ferns, Elk ferns and Australian Native Orchids. Well the orchids caught Gerald's eye and he was hooked. Gerald then began collecting orchids.

This interest enticed Gerald to travel to many countries in search of orchid species. He traveled with friends to Thailand, China, Borneo, Japan, India, USA, Brazil and Papua New Guinea. His traveling companion to Peru, Ecuador, Bolivia, and Chile was a Dutchman named Franz Beukelman, of the Orchid Species Society of Victoria, (OSSV). IN addition, in 1993, Gerald was made a Member of the Order Of Australia. (AM) for his service to horticulture, particularly orchids.

I asked Gerald how he found the time to travel to so many destinations. Gerald advised me that he was a self-employed business person. Gerald exported rabbits for food to Britain up until Whitlam came into Government. After Prime Minister Whitlam was elected there were many restrictions introduced on his type of business which unfortunately convinced Gerald to sell his main income source.

His late wife Nell had no interest in Orchids but was a marvelous support to Gerald. Helping with the rabbit business and looking after the children. Gerald fondly remembers his lovely wife Nell. The assistance that Nell provided allowed Gerald to follow his passion of collecting orchids.

Gerald has vivid recollections of his travels to Ecuador and Peru. In fact some of the orchids in his Orchid house bring back specific memories. Gerald can remember the area they were found in and can sometimes even recollect the tree they were attached to. Whilst in the Andes, Gerald found that orchids growing in the mountains 6000 foot about sea level were growing in similar conditions to Australia's cool climate. Therefore realizing that orchids grown in those regions could easily be grown in Melbourne.

Gerald loves attending the Maribyrnong Orchid Society meetings and shows. Gerald states that, "Maribyrnong is one of the Best run Orchid Societies in Melbourne." Gerald happily conveys that the Maribyrnong Club has a great crowd, excellent committee members who are well organized and the Shows are always terrific.

Gerald has enjoyed the pursuits he has had in his life. Other than being passionate about orchids, he is also extremely proud of his two wonderful daughters June and Lois and all his grandchildren.
