#### How does the point system work for benching plants at our meetings and shows?

Last month when this article was printed, the number of points awarded was incorrect. Please accept my apologies for any confusion caused by this error and take note of the corrections. Jenny (Editor)

Members receive points for benching plants:  
1 point for benching on the night (total of 1 point)  
Plus 2 points for each 2<sup>nd</sup> place in class  
Plus 3 points for each 1<sup>st</sup> place in class

Points can also be earned at Shows – double the number for meeting nights:

2 points for entering plants in the show (total of 2)  
Plus 4 points for each 2<sup>nd</sup> place in class  
Plus 6 points for each 1<sup>st</sup> place in class

One of the most complicated parts of belonging to our Orchid Society is ....

**"How do I enter a plant in the monthly competition or show?"**

I will try to guide you in doing this task: this article will relate to monthly competitions and the next article will be specifically for show entries. However, let me warn you, it is not easy and the number of people within our club who cannot do it, or explain how to do it, is surprising. Even those who you would think, because of their experiences within the club as members (and sometimes as Judges) should find the task easy, it is not.

So firstly, a few terms: Our plants are divided into **species** and **hybrids**.

**Species** are defined as "the plants that are growing naturally in the bush". How do you know if your plant is a species? The name tag of your plant **should** be written in lowercase letters, and probably in *italics* (this is expecting too much). You could check in the library to see if the plant is a species. (Or on the internet, or in your personal library, etc). Or you could ask someone. Just because your name tag is or isn't written in lowercase letters....does not mean it is a species.... it will also have to pass the ultimate test, that of the Judges. Once it is subjected to this the "final test", you will be relatively sure that you have a species orchid, so now carefully correct your name tag so that the plant will forever have its correct name and hence be able to be entered in its proper class.

eg *Dendrobium kingianum*

**Hybrids** are the result of a crossing between at least two species, or a species and a hybrid, etc. How do we tell whether a plant is a hybrid or not? Well, it should be easy....its label will be written in capital letters (or at least the first letter). The label of course is paramount....if it is lost, or defaced, the plant's identity is lost forever. Yes I know, someone will tell you the name of your unidentified plant when you bring it into the club....but they will be **guessing**. One of the interesting parts of belonging to an orchid society is joining the discussion of such "lost" plants, remember...it would be the same as "strangers" discussing your parentage. Just because you have white hair (it used to be red) does not mean you are my child?? The same with the educated guesses of the people "identifying" your plant.

eg *Cymbidium JUBILATION*

**The competition table and its rules**

The list of classes in which the plants compete, is not conclusive. It can be added to or taken away from to suit many different conditions.

The **schedule** listed below is what you will find on monthly meeting nights at Maribyrrnong:

When you look at the schedule notice that each class is denoted by:

1. a plant genus division, ie cymbidium, cattleya, etc
2. a subdivision of the genus. ie hybrid or species (sometimes).
  - If the class is written **Vandaceous** (only), this means it is only for hybrid Vandas. Species Vandas will be entered in the **"Species Any Genera"** class.
  - The sub division of the genus can also be broken up into lower sub divisions, ie by size.... **Cymbidium - Large**, which means that the flower is over 90 mm, across its width.

**Why is my plant not listed, and where do I put it?**

As I said the list cannot be inclusive, with all genera listed.

What about my plant, it is a *Phragmipedium* LIVING FIRE ?

Well, looking at my well preserved label, I notice that it is a Hybrid. How did I know that? Looking down the list of genera, "*Phragmipedium*" is not listed. So it must be entered in the **Any Other Hybrid**.

Another example, *Dendrobium* BARDO ROSE.

A hybrid, an Australian Native hybrid, so it must be entered in the class: **Australian Native Hybrid**

Question? Why not just enter it in the **Dendrobium** class?

Answer: The *Dendrobium* class is for non Australian *Dendrobiums*. *Dendrobium* Australian Native is a sub division of *Dendrobium*.

Well I hope that gets you going in entering your plants in the monthly competition...it is fun and an important part of club life....don't leave your plants at home...show them off, let all the members see your wonderful plants. Compare your plants with other members plants...if yours are growing "better" be a little proud....maybe you can help someone grow better. If your plants are not as good as others on the bench, try to find out how to improve your culture. If the above has not given you the confidence to enter your plants...please come in to me...I will try to help, promise.
