**MARIBYRNONG WINTER SHOW 2010
July 10th & 11th**

Our Winter Show is happening next month! Sales tickets, entry forms and tickets, etc, for the Winter show can be picked up at the June meeting, or phone 9689 1142 and they will be posted out to you.

New members please note: you may exhibit as many orchids in flower as you want in the show, but they must have been grown and owned by you for a minimum of 6 months. Orchids that have been owned by you for a lesser time may be exhibited in the Non-competitive section.

At the Autumn and Winter show, members may also exhibit other plants, cacti, bromeliad, fern, etc. They too must have been grown and owned by you for a minimum of 6 months. Awards for plants other than orchids come under a single section, meaning it is not divided up into Open, Intermediate and Novice.

If any members would like to offer their help during the show it will be greatly appreciated. Please let Anthony know, and he will allocate you a designated duty. Those members who help all day are given a lunch voucher, in appreciation. Those helping with the set up should be there by 12.30pm.

Orchid entry times are from 1.30pm - 6.00pm. Entries after this time will not be accepted, unless prior arrangements are made.

Members are asked not to bring their plants into the hall on the set up day for shows until the tables and chairs have all been reorganised, or until the Show Coordinator declares it is safe to do so.

If you wish to sell plants at our shows you must exhibit on the show-bench - the ratio is 8 plants to one exhibit. Members selling plants at our shows may bring them in after 3.30pm on the Friday preceding the show.

The Show closes at 4pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Please Note: The Sales area closes at 3.30pm on Sunday to enable members in this area to start the clean up. You are therefore required to collect your unsold plants at 3.30pm. Sales tickets must be removed and checked off on your sales sheet before taking plants away.

The Show area stays open till 4pm. The show area is cleaned up after that time.

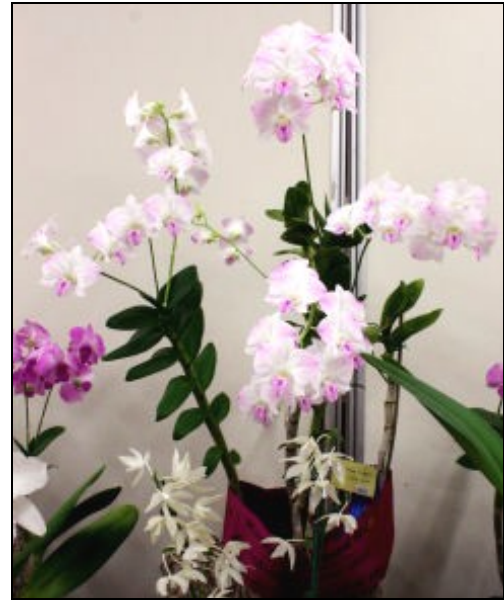

AN ARTICLE OF INTEREST

Recently, Margot Lattimore gave me a little booklet that was produced by the Victorian Orchid Club for their Orchid Exhibition held at Preston Motors Showroom, Russell Street, Melbourne, on 7th to 12th September, 1954. It was written by Gerald McCraith, our past club patron. This is an article from that booklet.

WE SAY IT WITH ORCHIDS

The object of the Grand Orchid Exhibition by the Victorian Orchid Club and this booklet is to interest the general public in the growing of Orchid plants, to have a general appreciation of the Orchid flowers, and to give some general knowledge about Orchids.

The usual reaction when Orchids are mentioned is that they are expensive and difficult to manage, and it is from the outset we wish to emphasise the hardiness of these plants, and the great ease of culture that is required for many of them.

Except for the very new modern hybrids, many Orchids can be bought very cheaply in relation to the benefits and pleasure they will give the grower, for not only are they the aristocrats of the flowering kingdom, but also most Orchid flowers have very long lasting qualities.

The knowledge and advice offered within must necessarily be brief, and we strongly recommend persons interested in the Culture of Orchids to become members of an Orchid Society-and, in particular, The Victorian Orchid Club. This Club has a number of amenities available to its members which include a well stocked and free library, monthly competitions, picture nights, cultural talks, a very informative monthly bulletin and most important is the congenial social side of the Club's activities. One of the main objects of the Club is "The advancement of all that pertains to Orchids, and the promotion of good fellowship".

In the past Orchid growing was considered a wealthy man's luxury, but this myth no longer exists, for a moderate purse and a little enthusiasm can begin the basis of a good collection and a large number of new friends.

Well, as you can see, what was written in 1954 still hasn't changed 56 years later. Unfortunately Maribyrnong Orchid Society was not started until 1981, and V.O.C. was the only club around at the time. This little booklet will eventually make it into the library but I would like to share some more of it with you in later bulletins. Thanks to Margot Lattimore for bringing to my attention.
